

Pray Without Ceasing

"Rejoice always, pray without ceasing, give thanks in all circumstances; for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you." —1 Thessalonians 5:16-18

Sometimes God places a matter upon your heart that just won't go away. It may persist for weeks or months. That's when you know God wants you to pay attention. Such has been the case for me lately when it comes to prayer.

When I go to class on Wednesday evenings at Quellen, I always try to get there an hour early. This allows time to go to the chapel and just be quiet and alone with God. It is the best hour of the week. It is a place that has been sanctified for over a century by prayer. You can feel the spiritual energy. Best of all, it is a time of solitude and contemplation without phones, distractions or outside interruptions.

The concerns of the day can be put aside. When a stone is thrown into a lake, there are many ripples and movements in the water. That's how our life can be. But after a while, the water becomes still and calm. The ripples cease. That's how it is when we quiet our hearts and minds and allow ourselves to focus on God.

God has answered so many prayers here at our church. We are above all a people who pray. But what God has taught me is that *we should expect Him to answer our prayers*. It won't always be the answer we want, but He *will* answer. *Don't pray and walk away!* You wouldn't ring a door bell and leave before someone answers. What if a person had a winning lottery ticket, but never claimed it? What God has for us is much better then that.

One evening I was sitting quietly in the chapel and praying about something that was upon my heart. Before I left, God said, "*Claim it. It's yours! Claim it. It's yours!*" I think too often the power of prayer goes unclaimed. It is like a treasure untapped. It is a spiritual currency that is never spent. What if we had 50,000 watts of power at our disposal, but never used it? God has my attention.

There's one other thing I have noticed when it comes to prayer. The most effective prayers for me are the ones that come from the heart and not the head. It's a prayer that brings a tear to the eye or a lump in the throat. The earnestness of the prayer does matter. I can't *tell* God anything that He doesn't already know, but I can pour my heart out. I can pray like a child pleas before his father. What God wants from us is not more information, but transformation when we pray. You should never be the same person after you pray.

How about you? What is your experience of prayer? When God keeps bringing the same thing before you, it is a good idea to pay attention. That may be the area where God is working in your life. So let's not ignore the power God has given us. You can move mountains, and it will be precisely what God expects. Blessings, Pastor Jeffrey
