

A Taste of Chautauqua

I hope you are having a good summer and are doing some things that renew your body and feed your soul. One of the things I am looking forward to this summer is spending a week at Chautauqua Institute in early August. Have you ever been to Chautauqua? My wife and I were there over twenty years ago BC — that is, "Before Children!" So it was a long time ago. Still, it made quite an impression, and it has been on our list as a place where we would like to return.

If you're not familiar with Chautauqua, it is located near Jamestown, New York, in the western part of New York State on Chautauqua Lake. It stretches over 750 acres, and for years has been a popular Christian institution and conference center. Their website describes their faith and religion programs this way —"Chautauqua provides a wide variety of services of worship and programs that express — the Institution's Christian heritage as well as its interfaith commitment. The Institution, originally the Chautauqua Lake Sunday School Assembly, was founded in 1874 by a Methodist Bishop as a teaching camp for Sunday School teachers. Initially Bible studies were conducted to teach about the Holy Land."

It is interesting to know that other Chautauqua type programs spread throughout the United States. According to the online reference source Wikipedia, "The Chautauqua movement spread throughout the United States and was highly popular until the start of the World War II. By the mid-1920s, when circuit Chautauquas were at their peak, they appeared in over 10,000 communities to audiences of more than 45 million; by about 1940 they had run their course."

"The ideals of the Chautauqua Institution were spread throughout the United States through a number of independent Chautauqua assemblies, incorporating many of the program components of the Institution. Several Independent Chautauquas continue into the 21st century." It is also on the National Register of Historic Places.

Chautauqua has evolved over the years. Today the Institution is a non-profit adult education center, offering programs during the summer months in religious education, Bible study, theology, and lectures on popular topics. It also offers music, art, dance and drama. Every morning begins with worship, and there are opportunities to take classes and workshops with noted Bible scholars, theologians, and authors.

In particular, we wanted to go during the week when John Philip Newell will be the featured speaker and worship leader. For many years John was the resident theologian and warden at the Abbey in Iona, Scotland. We have read many of his books, such as <u>Listening for the Heartbeat of God</u>. Today he is a well known speaker, author, and retreat leader all over the world. We are excited to hear his lectures on Celtic Christian spirituality, and to have conversations about his spiritual journey.

I hope you will have the opportunity to visit Chautauqua one of these summers. You can find out more about Chautauqua at their website — ciweb.org. It is renewing in both body and spirit, and is a place where the Word of God is still taught and embodied in numerous ways.
