



Holy Conversations

Last month I wrote about our upcoming trip to Chautauqua Institute in upstate New York. This month I decided to share some personal reflections after that experience. At some point in my life I learned that whenever God puts something on your heart that won't go away, it is worth paying attention to.

As a boy of twelve, I went to Chautauqua for the first time with my grandmother. Perhaps the most remarkable thing is that it made such an impression on a young boy that I wanted to go back. I remember thinking that one of the greatest honors anyone could receive was being asked to speak there! Well that never happened, but once again I did go back, this time with my wife. That was twenty three years ago.

So a couple months ago I discovered that John Philip Newell was going to be preaching this summer. As I mentioned last month, he is one of my favorite writers, and has had a tremendous influence on me and how I think about my faith. He served as the resident chaplain on the island of Iona, Scotland prior to our visit in 2012. His books and talks on Celtic Christianity have been very formative in my faith journey.

At some point I realized that most of the writers and preachers who have been important to me are no longer living! So it was a great opportunity to listen to someone preach who speaks and embodies the Word of God very deeply — someone whose own faith journey and personal stories have produced a wealth of experience.

We attended worship every morning, and sometimes in the evening. Imagine feeling like you were in church or a worshipful environment all day long! Over 8,000 people were there for the same purpose — to learn and grow deeper in their faith. No wonder it was easy to strike up meaningful conversations with strangers while standing in line, and discovering you had a lot in common. That in itself was amazing.

Every moment of every day can be instructive when it comes to growing deeper in our faith and walk with God. But sometimes our hearts burn and our minds are supremely open to His Word, discovering insights we never thought of before. Sometimes there are particular people who touch us and guide our feet in the way of truth. I'm sure there have been people like that in your life.

There have been important mentors for me — pastors, teachers, professors, coaches, and many others. But hearing John Philip preach each day was special. A wise preaching professor once said to our seminary class — "A good sermon is one that allows you to laugh and cry in the same sermon." That certainly was true for me during the week.

There was a chance to meet him at the end of the service, and another opportunity to talk during a book signing. My words to him were simple: "I felt all week when you spoke that my tears were always just beneath the surface." He nodded knowingly.

That night I was reading about Colomba — the founder of the Abbey in Iona who was responsible for spreading Christianity throughout Scotland and Britain. His words jumped out at me. He said: "Your measure of prayer shall be until your tears come." Was it a coincidence I was reading his words the same day? I think not. They were tears that recognized that I had just heard someone speak from a deep and holy place . . . someone who stirred the waters from a sacred well, and allowed me to drink.

God is constantly stirring the waters from a well deep inside each one of us, inviting us to drink, and engage in holy conversations. Where are the waters being stirred in you today?
