


Spreading the Joy of Jesus' Love

Happy St. Patrick's Day to All!!! Let's hope it doesn't snow or rain on our Parade. Your Board of Deacon's ~ Mary Dieker



Lent: A Time for New Beginnings

It happens around this time every year: the winter seems unbearably long; the days are too short; and the temperature stays below freezing. Enough already! Spirits plummet with the temperatures and the barren landscape. When will spring ever come? A friend said they spotted a couple crocuses beginning to sprout in their yard. Since then we got nearly a foot of snow!

Beneath the snow and beyond the cover of winter, I look for subtle signs of spring. For that I have come to rely on the inner compass that governs the spiritual landscape. That's where Lent comes in. Very soon we will mark the beginning of Lent with an Ash Wednesday service. Once again this year we will have weekly programs at our community churches. Our church will host on Thursday, March 30 at 7 PM. We will use a book and DVD by Adam Hamilton entitled "Twenty Four Hours That Changed the World." Attending these bible studies is a good way to prepare for Lent.

Over the years I have come to understand that Lent is the time — maybe the best time—for new beginnings. There is never a better time to return to God then over the forty days of Lent. It is a time for prayer, increased spiritual reflection, worship and reading of scripture. We can follow the example of our Lord, who spent forty days in the wilderness fasting and in prayer. He used this time to prepare for his ministry and the journey to Jerusalem that lay ahead. During these days, we can do the same.

Lent is after all a time for hope and new beginnings. Somewhere beneath the winter's snow, signs of spring will slowly emerge. Somewhere deep within our souls, the stirring of new life has begun. May you experience God's rich promise of



new life during these days. Soon we will be able to echo the sentiment in the Song of Solomon: "See! The winter is past . . . Flowers appear on the earth; the season of singing has come." — Song of Solomon 2:11-12
