

"If Christ is not raised, then we above all people are to be most pitied."— 1 Corinthians 15:19

I hope you all had a wonderful, blessed Easter. He is risen! He is risen indeed! And in the days following Easter, the news gets even better. In the liturgical calendar, the church celebrates seven weeks of Easter. Jesus himself remained with his disciples for 40

that is inevitable when we lose someone we love. Yet the power of Easter and new life reminded me that we never lose those we love. One day after a heart felt prayer and many tears, God whispered in my ear, "Your best friend lives, and is walking right beside you if you open your eyes and heart." Sure enough, his words were to be trusted and true. I still take long walks in the woods. I still behold the beauty of a sunset, and I could swear there is a set of paw prints that follows my every step. Deep in my heart, I know our risen Lord would have it no other way.
