



Count Your Blessings

This season has been a time of many blessings for our family. Last month we sat in the football stadium at Lehigh University as Jackson was awarded his degree. A month later we were in a football stadium again as Joshua graduated from high school. At about the same time, we were blessed with a new addition to our family — Sophia, a 2 year old Golden Retriever we rescued. She is a joy and a delight.

As we returned home from the graduations, there was one thought that kept coming into my mind and wouldn't go away: "Thank you Lord for letting me witness this moment." "THANK YOU LORD FOR LETTING ME WITNESS THIS MOMENT!" It brings a tear to the eye and joy to the heart when we experience such beautiful moments. We should not take them for granted.

Graduations are one of those significant chapters and mile markers in life that you hope to live to see. It makes a parent proud and has a sacramental quality to it.

Upon further reflection, it occurred to me that this is the perspective God wants us to have every day. These moments may not be large, but the Lord pours out his blessings upon us. We can join the Psalmist as he writes: "Give thanks to the Lord, for he is good; his love endures forever." (Psalm 118:1) In another Psalm, we read: "Bless the Lord, O my soul: and all that is within me, bless his holy name." (Psalm 103:1)

In my devotions one morning, I read something from the writings of St. Basil of Caesarea that echoed these thoughts. St. Basil lived around 357AD, and he was a keen observer of the details in everyday life that he understood were blessings from God. He writes: "Give thanks in deeds of virtue that extend to every part and moment of our lives. 'Whether you eat,' it is said, 'or drink, or whatever you do, do all for the glory of God.' As you take your seat at table, pray. As you lift the loaf, offer thanks to the Giver... As you are putting on your tunic, thank the Giver of it. As you wrap your cloak about yourself, feel yet greater love to God, who alike in summer and in winter has given us coverings convenient for us, and at once preserves our life. Is the day done? Give thanks to Him Who has given us the sun for our daily work, and has provided for us a fire to light up the night."

The warm days and nights of summer are sure to sow many seeds in your heart that are ripe to burst forth into blessings at any moment. You may be at the shore and watch the waves crash upon the beach and marvel at the majesty of God. You may be sitting on your back porch and behold a sunrise or sunset. You may notice a firefly light up the night sky. You may receive an unexpected visit or a message from a dear friend. On one of the first warm days of summer, I was walking in the woods with my dog, and as we passed through a grove that was surrounded by trees and birds singing (much to Sophia's distraction!), I thought, "My Lord and my God, what a marvelous moment this is, that first of all we should even be alive, and secondly that we are surrounded by your beauty in nature to behold."

Where will you be this summer when a blessing falls upon your path as suddenly as a spring shower? What will you be doing when out of nowhere, you stop and exclaim, "My Lord and my God! How fortunate I am to be experiencing this moment here with you." You never know when even one of a million seeds God has planted in you will burst forth into a blessing. I pray there will be many such moments for you this summer, and like the stars, they will be too numerous to count.
