




INK CARTRIDGES RECYCLE

In worship on Christmas Eve every year, I light a new white candle, to portray that Emmanuel, God, is with us, and I light this same candle every Sunday at the beginning of worship. I call this the Jesus Candle, and use it to remind us that where God's people gather in worship, Jesus is always with us.

I lit a new Jesus Candle at the First Presbyterian Church of Cranbury Meadow Lakes Congregation on Christmas Eve 2017. As some of you are aware, the FPCC Meadow Lakes Congregation held its last worship service the next week, December 31st. As the Jesus Candle would no longer be used at Meadow Lakes, it came with me when I packed up my stuff.

I brought the Jesus Candle to First

Presbyterian Church of South Amboy and lit it on Easter, reminding us that Jesus is the Light of the World, and all the darkness of the world, even death, cannot put the Light out. The Jesus Candle sat on the Communion Table, in the midst of the Bread/Body and Juice/Blood to show that Jesus is in the midst of the meal he gave us to remember him.

Since then the Jesus Candle has been lit at the beginning of worship, and will continue to be every Sunday. It doesn't always show up very well, as its light is dissipated in the brightness of our Sanctuary. But on the Third Sunday of Easter, April 15th, when the electric power was off in much of South Amboy, and in our church, when the Jesus Candle was lit, its light and its glow filled our darkened worship space in a way that drew our attention throughout the service. It reminded us, in a new way, that Jesus really is the Light of the World that darkness cannot quench.

Every Sunday now, at the beginning of worship, the Jesus Candle will be lit. May it remind us of all the things Jesus is, among them Emmanuel, God with us, that Jesus is with us in the meal he gave us to remember him, that Jesus is the Light of the World, and that whenever God's people meet to worship, Jesus is in our midst.
