

We begin our 30 days of Thankfulness (another name for November) with a sense of the year drawing in. Days are shorter, darkness begins around 5pm, and we're turning on the heat and bringing out our sweaters and coats. As we begin the month, we pause to take a deep breath because we know that in a few days time will start moving at warp speed and before we know it, we'll be in 2019.

In worship this month, every Sunday has a theme. **November 7** is All Saints' Sunday, and we will be celebrating the saints of our church and in our lives, both living and gone ahead of us into heaven, and we will share together the Lord's Supper. **November 11** is, yes, Veterans' Day and we will be honoring and thanking our veterans, but it is also the 100th Anniversary of the end of World War I and we will be remembering before God the 40 million soldiers, sailors, medical personnel, and civilians (dead from battle or disease, missing, and wounded) from the 30 countries that were involved in what was called at the time "The War to End Wars." **November 18** we will be "gathering together to ask the Lord's blessing" as we celebrate Thanksgiving Sunday, and **November 25** we will again be celebrating the Lord's Supper as we mark Christ the King Sunday, the theme of which is Christ coming again in Glory. I hope that you will be with us in worship on these Sundays as we pause in our headlong rush toward the Christmas holidays to worship the God who comes to us every day of the year.

Sunday School has made a great start, as teachers and leaders Christine Vella, Judy Scharff, Shirley Weaver, Jennifer Bellina welcomed our children. We will be focusing on two stories from Genesis this Fall, God's creation of a Garden and of Man and Woman, and the story of Noah and God's promise and covenant. As December approaches, we will be working on the Children's program for Advent.

I am enjoying learning the ways that you live out your Christian faith here in First Pres., in big ways and small - both ways are important. Your hunger ministry/food pantry is a major effort that you carry out month by month, and the way that you pray and care for one another, although it might seem to be a smaller effort is, in fact, what undergirds your life together as the People of God - the Body of Christ - in this place.

During the 30 days of Thankfulness that mark the month of November, I will be continually thanking God for the First Presbyterian Church of South Amboy, its members and friends, and for calling me to be in your midst as your Interim Pastor.
