

Our Office Secretary, Shirley Weaver, works very hard for the Lord at our church. For some of her work, she is paid (as she should be, although




she is worth her weight in gold, and we don't have any gold). It seems as if Shirley is always at church, making sure that our systems run smoothly and God's people are cared for.



Musings from the Pastor...... A colleague who was a hospice chaplain, asked me, "Do you know what people want to know as they are facing death?" I answered, "What is heaven like?" "No," my colleague answered, "they want to know 'did my life make a difference?""

That conversation happened many years ago, but I have never forgotten it. Even though I hope it is many years before I go home to be with the Lord, I often ask myself, "Will having lived \_\_\_\_ years on this earth have made a difference some how, some where, to somebody? And then this thought follows, "How will I be remembered?"

I think these are good questions to ask ourselves as we journey through life on this earth, because I think they can influence how we live in the here and now.

When I was editing the I on g Martin Luther King, Jr. sermon, "The Drum Major Instinct" to present to you on the Sunday of MLK, Jr. weekend, I read his answer to these questions, and I thought, "Yes, yes,", let these be my answers also. I share them with you now, so that you may read them over and over, and let them influence how you live in the here and now, too.

If any of you are around when I have to meet my day, I don't want a long funeral. And if you get somebody to deliver the eulogy, tell them not to talk too long. (Yes) And every now and then I wonder what I want them to say. Tell them not to mention that I have a Nobel Peace Prize—that isn't important. Tell them not to mention that I have three or four hundred other awards—that's not important. Tell them not to mention where I went to school.

I'd like somebody to mention that day that Martin Luther King, Jr., tried to give his life serving others.

I'd like for somebody to say that day that Martin Luther King, Jr., tried to love somebody.

I want you to say that day that I tried to be right on the war question.

I want you to be able to say that day that I did try to feed the hungry.

And I want you to be able to say that day that I did try in my life to clothe those who were naked.

I want you to say on that day that I did try in my life to visit those who were in prison.

I want you to say that I tried to love and serve humanity.

Yes, if you want to say that I was a drum major, say that I was a drum major for justice. Say that I was a drum major for peace. I was a drum major for righteousness. And all of the other shallow things will not matter. I won't have any money to leave behind. I won't have the fine and luxurious things of life to leave behind. But I just want to leave a committed life behind. And that's all I want to say.

If I can help somebody as I pass along,

If I can cheer somebody with a word or song,

If I can show somebody he's traveling wrong,

Then my living will not be in vain.

If I can do my duty as a Christian ought,

If I can bring salvation to a world once wrought,

If I can spread the message as the master taught,

Then my living will not be in vain.

Yes, Jesus, I want to be on your right or your left side, not for any selfish reason. I want to be on your right or your left side, not in terms of some political kingdom or ambition. But I just want to be there in love and in justice and in truth.....

And let God's people say, "Amen."
