Pretzels for Lent

Did you know that the humble pretzel — \checkmark believed to be made by an Italian monk in the 6th century—is a symbol of Lent?

Pretzels look like arms folded over the heart, a once popular position for praying. The word "pretzel" may come from the Latin word "bracellae" meaning "little arms". It's also possible that the word is derived from the Latin "pretiola", meaning "little reward", as monks gave them to children as treats for their recited prayers. Germans named the treat "bretzel", which became "pretzel". Pretzels were a substitute for bread during Lent, particularly in Austria, Germany, and Poland, for those who were fasting from milk, eggs, and fats. Today, certain restaurants in Europe will only serve pretzels during Lent as a tradition.

One of the ingredients in pretzels is yeast, which Jesus talked about in a parable: "Again He asked, 'What shall I compare the kingdom of God to? It is like yeast that a woman took and mixed into about sixty pounds of flour until it worked all through the dough" Luke 13:20–21

The kingdom of God will increase and spread just as yeast does in dough. As yeast makes dough rise from the inside, God's influence starts internally in our hearts. Yeast acts invisibly throughout all of the dough, as God does throughout Creation. Enjoy some pretzels this Easter season and cherish their spiritual symbolism!








INK CARTRIDGES RECYCLE

From the Interim Pastor.....

The month of April is a beautiful month here in New Jersey. The trees begin to bud out and put on their summer clothes, Spring flowers bloom, blossoms are everywhere, and the breeze begins to feel warm instead of shivery, the days lengthen, and even the proverbial April showers give us a sense of the ground being watered instead of flooded.

Except for allergy sufferers, the world is suddenly a happier place.

Liturgically, this month serves up the most heartbreak, in our journey with Jesus we follow him into the Garden of Gethsemane, and then to his arrest, torture, torment, and excruciating death. As we sit in the darkness of Good Friday, we seem to hear the taunts that echo from Old Testament passages, "Where is now your God?" And we sit with that and we hold on to our faith as strongly as we can, remembering the Jesus candle on our communion table that speaks of the Light of the World that can never be extinguished. And on Easter, our hearts are mended with threads of Joy, as we see that even death cannot hold our God, and with songs of "Hallelujah!" we celebrate the Resurrection of Jesus.

Come and worship with us this month of heartbreak and joy. Going to the cross with Jesus makes the joy of his resurrection turn our mourning into dancing!

I am glad to be a Presbyterian. But when it comes to a church looking for and choosing a new pastor, I sometimes wish I was an Episcopalian or a United Methodist or a Roman Catholic. What would it be like to have a Bishop say, "Here's your new Pastor" or "Here's your new Priest." "S/He will start on July 1st...."

But like other non-hierarchical churches (Congregational/UCC, Reformed, Baptist), Presbyterians believe that God speaks to and through a congregation when it comes to choosing pastoral leadership.

So there's work ahead of the congregation of The First Presbyterian Church of South Amboy. No one is going to gift us with a new pastor. Not Presbytery, not the Session. The congregation - in our case, members and friends who worship together regularly - have to come together to talk and pray about what we want in our next pastor, what kind of leader do we want? Where do we want our church to go in the years ahead? We won't all agree, but I believe with love and respect for each other, we will come to a consensus and be able to find the person God is preparing for our church.

Session will be hosting a luncheon immediately following worship on Sunday, April 28th. Elders will begin by leading a discussion, but this is an opportunity for us all to listen and speak. All the work will not be done at this one luncheon, we will need to have more opportunities to get together in the months ahead. Session members are already working toward and praying about this meeting.
