





Remember the Purpose

"And they devoted themselves to the apostles teaching and the fellowship, to the breaking of bread and the prayers." Acts 2:42 (ESV)

And Jesus came and said to them, "All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you. And behold, I am with you always, to the end of the age." Matthew 28:18-20 (ESV)

Why does our church exist? Do we exist for others entertainment? Is our purpose to be a glorified community center or some kind of social club? Or did God plant a church on Broadway in South Amboy for a bigger purpose?

See the readings above. While the church has always had a social element to it, and we rightfully emphasize that we are a *community* of believers, we have to remember what our community exists for.

We exist above all to glorify God and enjoy him forever. In fact that is the reason we gather on Sundays - to glorify Him through our worship. We gather to remind ourselves of God's promises and grow in the grace and knowledge of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ (2 Peter 3:18), and we do so through teaching, fellowship, worship, and prayer that Acts 2 emphasizes.

Yet we cannot forget the importance of also glorifying God through making His Name known to others! There's a reason God doesn't immediately take us home to glory as soon as we believe the gospel - there is still work to be done down here!

So this month as we start preparing and making plans for the summer, let's pause to remember our purpose. Are we prioritizing God's glory in our lives, or just entertainment? Do we desire to be about the great commission of taking the gospel to others? Or are we preoccupied with our comforts? Consider these questions as you make your plans, and make sure what really matters to you is reflected in your choices. Whether that is our summer outreaches, or through our regular worship on Sundays, may God be glorified in all we do. Let's remember our purpose as a church, and as members of it.
