



Mountains & Valleys

"But grow in the grace and knowledge of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. To him be the glory both now and to the day of eternity. Amen." 2 Peter 3:18 (ESV)

An early mentor of mine in the faith once taught me that the Christian life is not lived on the "mountaintop experiences" of emotional and spiritual highs, but it's lived in the valleys of ordinary life. Our goal as Christians is not to seek high emotional experiences and label them "spiritual", but to recognize the incredible spiritual power of simply living our lives for Jesus, wherever we are called to be this season.

I used to view the feeling I would experience at a high energy youth conference as the "ideal" for the Christian life that was to be sought after at all costs. I still view those experiences as good, but I've learned over the years that what many of us would view as "ordinary" is actually what has the greater and more extraordinary impact on our walk with Jesus.

It's great to come from a passionate "mountaintop" experience like a retreat or conference, but let that experience spark a desire to have a more meaningful devotional life! It's great to feel the emotional awe from praising God with a professional worship team, but may that build our own anticipation and desire to open the hymnals at church all the more or to play Christian music in our homes. I've learned so much over the years from "big name conference speakers", but I have learned far more about Jesus in the quiet of my own home with nothing but my bible and my coffee.

As I write this, we are still coming down from the mountaintop experience of our first Multicultural Night. What a fabulous experience that was! Wasn't it exciting to see our downstairs "packed out" with people? Didn't it fill our hearts with joy to hear worship music and preaching launched into the heart of our city?

However, as wonderful as it was, we must recognize it for the mountaintop that it is. We don't "live" on the mountain. True life, spiritual growth, and growth of the church happens in the valleys of everyday life. It happens when we meet for worship every Sunday, when we meet for bible studies, when we fellowship for coffee hour, when we pray together, and in our private worship & devotional life. The spiritual impact of the "everyday living" far surpasses the power of any big event we could throw.

Therefore let us rejoice in what we just experienced together, let us rejoice in the great good God brought through this event, let us also look forward to the *next* mountaintop experience - and let us praise him and live for him in the valley where true spiritual life takes place until that day!
