

Place a candle inside






# AUTUMN PRAYER

# What are we to make of "that" holiday?

"Take no part in the unfruitful works of darkness, but instead expose them." Ephesians 5:11 (ESV)

"I know and am persuaded in the Lord Jesus that nothing is unclean in itself, but it is unclean for anyone who thinks it unclean." Romans 14:14 (ESV)

Recently I did a sermon entitled "Frequently Asked Questions" because the text of Matthew 24:32-42 has several verses that require careful interpretation and thought to discover their meaning and are often asked about. One of the questions clergy all over America will be asked this month is "what are we to make of Halloween?"

Certainly there are pastors who will argue to avoid it at all costs, and their concerns are not misplaced. It's roots are unquestionably pagan, and it's modern practice in America today celebrates and glorifies darkness, evil, violence, and even indecency. Some of the displays already up in my neighborhood will testify to this. Can we readily participate in practices that celebrate what does not bring God glory?

It is easy to see it this way when I wear my "theologian hat", but there are beautiful parts to this time of year as well. The day is full of fun and imagination. A day of creativity, of the arts, and of community - where many people will knock on your door that would otherwise not walk down your street.

As Christians, let us not hide from the darkness this year, but let's put on display "the light of the world" Jesus Christ! We are called to be "in" the world, but not "of" it. Therefore, let's use this opportunity to meet our neighbors and build relationships where we can invite our new friends to church. Let's order some gospel tracts online and hand them out to the children (*with* candy...don't be *that* person). Let us pray for opportunities when the world is fascinated with the dead and darkness to introduce them to the "light of the world", who is "not the God of the dead but of the living", who came to raise the dead, and give us life abundantly.

Let us therefore carefully navigate this way according to our God given convictions. Let us not glory in what is corrupt and displeasing to God, but let us celebrate the beauty that is there and use the coming day to engage in things that do glorify God.
