May Bible Verses



Happenings & New Beginnings

I want to thank everyone for their kind words, prayers, cards, and all other kinds of display of love the last few weeks celebrating the birth of my son: Malachi Joseph Mottley. You have made his entry into this world all the more sweet and wonderful. Ashley and I are both doing well, we are both just tired and adjusting to the new lifestyle pace of 4 children in the home.

That being said, life at the church does not stop just because we had a baby! Much has been happening and much is being planned that I would like to remark on briefly.

National Day of Prayer is May 1st this year, so please make plans if able to join us at the flagpole in front of City Hall for a time of prayer, worship, and interceding to God on behalf of our nation that so needs his mercy.

Please also mark your calendar for our Multi-Cultural Night on June 20th. We had a fabulous time last year celebrating the diversity God has blessed our community with, and we were all enriched when we rejoiced over our differences and tried something new! As always the event is free, but I ask that our members participate with a small price: bringing a friend!

Finally, I wanted to give an update on our progress in leaving our current denomination. As many of you know, we are seeking to disaffiliate from the PC(USA) denomination of Presbyterian Churches and join the EPC denomination of Presbyterian churches. "We" are not becoming anything different, we are simply joining a fellowship of churches that more closely reflects who we are. We voted unanimously as the members of the congregation to seek this change, and we are currently in talks with members of our current Presbytery to finalize all of this very soon. Should these talks remain in good faith we are confident things will end well for all of us.

I was reminded this week that this move was necessary as I heard a sermon from one minister in our current denomination teach that we can go to heaven by doing good works, without repenting of our sins, and without any mention of trusting in Christ alone. This demonstrates the fundamental chasm between what the bible teaches and what this denomination believes.

Many new beginnings are taking place this season. How exciting is it that there is so much new life, new opportunities, and things to be excited about! Especially as we watch the earth itself come alive again after the winter. May God bless you this month, and we sincerely look forward to seeing you at some of these fellowship events coming up.
