"Frequently Asked Questions" from the 1600's written by Presbyterians.

Q16: Did all mankind fall in Adam's first disobedience?

A: Since the covenant was made not only for Adam but also for his natural descendants, all mankind sinned in him and fell with him in his first disobedience.

Comment from Pastor John: Adam did not sin merely as a private individual, but as the representative head of the human race. When he disobeyed, the consequences of that sin—guilt, corruption, and death—spread to all his descendants, which helps us understand why sin and brokenness are universal realities. Have you ever met someone who has never sinned? This is why. Yet this hard truth also prepares us to rejoice in the good news: just as Adam's fall affected many, so Christ's obedience brings life to all who are united to Him by faith. Jesus is the "true and greater Adam" in this sense, as he kept the covenant that Adam could not. Thanks be to God!

Stepping Into the Future

Looking ahead, I believe 2026 will be a truly transformational year for our church—not because everything will suddenly be easy or perfect, but because we are intentionally stepping into what we have been striving toward. You will see more outreach, more community events, greater focus, and a renewed sense of purpose in how we do ministry together. At the same time, our heart remains unchanged: to glorify God in all that we do and to make Christ fully known in the hearts and lives of the people in South Amboy.

As we begin a new year together, I also want to gently encourage each of you to reflect personally, not just corporately. January often invites resolutions, but I want to ask a different kind of question—one that goes deeper than habits or schedules:
